

Katmai National Park is located on the Alaska Peninsula in southwest Alaska. It is famous for its volcanoes, salmon and the world's largest protected population of brown bears, estimated at 2,200 individuals. Visitors come to see and photograph the brown bears that congregate at Brook's Falls to feed on the abundant spawning salmon.

David Govatski will focus on the brown bears of Katmai and why it is one of the best places in the world to see brown bears. We will also cover the other wildlife, plants and the spectacular geology of the Valley of the 10,000 Smokes.
